

# Community Safety and Well-Being Backgrounder



## Overview

The City of Ottawa is in the process of developing Ottawa's first [Community Safety and Well-Being \(CSWB\) Plan](#) as required by the *Safer Ontario Act, 2018*. The CSWB Plan will outline strategies and actions to improve safety and well-being for everyone in Ottawa. While the City is the lead in developing the CSWB Plan, we all have a role to play and as such, the CSWB Plan will leverage ongoing initiatives and may include actions from various partners, and not just the City of Ottawa.

A CSWB Plan is a way to work together to address common objectives to ensure Ottawa is a safe, healthy, and vibrant community. The vision is to work together to achieve sustainable communities where everyone feels safe, has a sense of belonging and opportunities to participate, and where individuals and families are able to meet their needs for education, health care, food, housing, income, and social and cultural expression.

A six phase development approach, approved by City Council in October 2019 in the Roadmap [report](#), is currently underway. The final CSWB Plan will feature prioritized goals and strategies for collective actions.

## Topics for Consideration

The City of Ottawa, in consultation with the Community Safety and Well-Being Advisory Committee (Crime Prevention Ottawa Board of Directors), identified 20 topic areas to help focus the conversation in the priority-setting phase. The CSWB Team is currently completing consultations and research to identify the top priorities from this list that will be the focus of Ottawa's CSWB Plan.
