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## Community Vaccination Clinics (Mass Immunization Clinics)

Open to all Ottawa residents 50 and older, **or** residents 18 and older in “hot spots” with postal codes that begin with K1T, K1V and K2V.

Appointments are currently available for eligible residents between now and May 31.

## High-priority and hot spot neighbourhoods

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### Mega pop-up clinic

Starting this weekend, a temporary mega pop-up clinic at the Infinity Convention Centre, located at 2901 Gibford Drive, will open to target nearby hot spots identified by the Province. Appointments for this site, which will operate again next weekend, can be booked through the Provincial Booking System, subject to appointment availability.

### Drop-in clinics

We are implementing new approaches for pop-up clinics in high-priority communities. The City of Ottawa and Ottawa Public Health are piloting **drop-in** vaccine clinics for residents 18 years and older living in priority neighbourhoods identified by Ottawa Public Health.

These clinics are drop-in only, no appointments required. There will be a limited amount of vaccines available each day.

### Door-to-door (Airplane Model)

We are also working with Community Health Centres and community housing partners to visit residential buildings in these neighbourhoods, going door-to-door and floor-to-floor, vaccinating residents right where they live.

## Mobile Vaccination Teams

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- Mobile vaccination teams are providing vaccinations to congregate care settings, including high-risk shelters and homebound residents.
- **Homebound residents:** OPH is actively working with health partners including Community Health Centres (CHCs) to support in-home vaccination of homebound health-care recipients. Eligible recipients will be contacted to book





an in-home vaccination. Currently, homebound health-care recipients are the only group eligible for in-home vaccination. Once vaccines have been provided to everyone in this group, OPH will work with its partners to identify other homebound residents.

## Indigenous clinics

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- OPH and Wabano Centre for Aboriginal Health are providing vaccines to First Nation, Inuit and Métis community members 16+
  - Clinic is located at St-Laurent Complex, 525 Côté Street

- Akausivik Inuit Family Health Team is providing vaccines to *all* Inuit adults.

## Essential workers

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- **Group 1** essential workers are eligible to register for an appointment. This group includes:
  - staff in elementary and secondary schools;
  - workers who respond to critical events;
  - enforcement, inspection and compliance workers;
  - people who work in licensed childcare settings;
  - agricultural and farm workers, and those in food manufacturing and distribution; and
  - other workers identified in the province's "[Group 1](#)".
- **Group 2** is expected to become [eligible the week of May 10](#).

## Healthcare workers

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- [Moderate priority](#) health-care workers can pre-register for a vaccine appointment on [OPH's online pre-registration tool](#).
- Pre-registration continues for highest priority, very-high priority and high-priority health-care workers.

## Individuals with highest/high-risk health conditions

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- Individuals with highest and high-risk health conditions and their caregivers are eligible to book an appointment on the Provincial Booking System.
- Visit the [provincial vaccination plan](#) for more details on Phase 2 vaccine sequencing based on age and risk.
- Eligibility is expected to expand to individuals with 'at-risk' health conditions the week of May 10.



## **General Information**

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### **Total doses administered:**

- For up-to-date information on COVID-19 vaccination in Ottawa, including the number of doses administered, visit OPH's [COVID-19 Vaccination Dashboard](#).

### **Booking second doses:**

- Residents who use the provincial booking system are asked to schedule their first and second doses when they make appointments.
- Residents who book through the OPH booking line will only receive their first dose appointment, unless they are First Nation, Inuit or Métis community members.
  - We know many residents are eager to book their second dose. The Province has advised that a solution is in progress. Residents are encouraged to [sign-up](#) for the City's e-newsletter and follow local news sources for more information. OPH and the City will communicate to the public when second dose appointments are available.

### **Remaining end of day doses:**

- Where there is a leftover supply of vaccines at the end of the day, due to cancelled appointments or other reasons, clinic administrators offer them to front-line workers who have not yet received their first dose or pre-booked and pre-registered individuals, in accordance with the with the Province of Ontario's plan and [ethical framework](#) to distribute the vaccine. Vaccine wastage in Ottawa has been very minimal and uncommon.
