Community Vaccination Clinics (Mass Immunization Clinics)

Open to all Ottawa residents 40 and older, **or** residents 18 and older in "hot spots" with postal codes that begin with K1T, K1V and K2V. Appointments are currently available for eligible residents between now and June 14.





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Appointments are currently available at the following community vaccination clinics:

- Infinity Convention Centre, 2901 Gibford Drive
- Nepean Sportsplex, 1701 Woodroffe Avenue
- Ruddy Family YMCA-YWCA, 265 Centrum Boulevard
- Eva James Memorial Community Centre, 65 Stonehaven Drive
- City Hall, 110 Laurier Avenue West

These sites are in addition to hospital-based clinics operating at the Queensway-Carleton Hospital and at the Ottawa Hospital - Civic Campus. Additional community vaccination clinics will open as vaccine supply increases over time.

High-priority and Hot Spot Neighbourhoods

Over the weekend, a drop-in/pop-up clinic is planned for the communities of Bayshore-Belltown and Whitehaven-Queensway Terrace North. This will be the final drop-in pop-up clinic under our pilot. Mobile Vaccination Teams

 Mobile vaccination teams are providing vaccinations to congregate care settings, including shelters and homebound residents.



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- Homebound residents: OPH continues to actively work with health partners to support in-home vaccination of homebound healthcare recipients. Homebound health care recipients are the only group eligible for in-home vaccination at this time.
 - OPH continues collaboration with its partners to identify additional homebound residents and has begun to immunize them and an essential caregiver, in-home. Homebound clients can request in-home vaccination by themselves, by their caregiver, or by referral from their primary care provider by calling the OPH Vaccine Booking Line at 613-691-5505 - Option #2.
 - Please note, we are not promoting this booking line process broadly. We are working with our health care partners (ex: Community Health Centres, Home Care and Community Support Services, physicians, health and social services) to ensure that those most in need have access to appropriate services. We are defining a homebound resident as: an individual who has medical, physical, cognitive, or psychosocial needs/conditions that inhibit them from visiting a local clinic, pharmacy, or their primary care provider to receive their COVID-19 vaccination.

Indigenous Clinics

- OPH and Wabano Centre for Aboriginal Health are providing vaccines to First Nation, Inuit and Métis community members 16+

Youth 12-17 years old

The <u>Province</u> has announced that youth in Ontario between 12 and 17 years, and their family members who have not received a vaccine, will be eligible to book an appointment for their first dose of the Pfizer vaccine beginning the week of May 31. Planning is currently underway, and more details will be available in coming weeks.

Second Doses

The Province has announced that high-risk health care workers, First Nations, Inuit and Métis community members and individuals with certain health conditions are eligible to receive their second dose of the COVID-19 vaccine earlier than the extended four-month interval. The EOC is reviewing this direction and is planning accordingly. Additional details will be announced as soon as feasible.



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General Information

Total doses administered:

Booking second doses:

- Residents who use the provincial booking system are asked to schedule their first and second doses when they make appointments.
- To ensure that there was no delay locally, Ottawa Public Health and the City of Ottawa began vaccinating eligible residents in advance of the launch of the provincial booking system. We can appreciate that residents are eager to book their second dose appointments. At this time, the Province of Ontario's booking system is not able to book individual appointments. The Province has noted that they are currently working to make this option available so that an individual second dose appointment may be reserved.
 - Residents are encouraged to <u>sign-up</u> for the City's e-newsletter and follow local news sources for more information. The City and OPH will undertake a mass communications campaign when second dose appointments are available.
