Community Vaccination Clinics (Mass Immunization Clinics)

Open to **all** Ottawa residents 12 and older. Youth must be 12 or older on the day of their appointment. Appointments at community clinics are currently limited and availability is fluctuating as residents make schedule changes or cancellations. We will continue to add appointments into the booking system as vaccine supply is confirmed by the Province.

Vaccinations are currently available at the following community clinics

- Nepean Sportsplex, 1701 Woodroffe Avenue
- Ruddy Family YMCA-YWCA, 265 Centrum Boulevard
- Eva James Memorial Community Centre, 65 Stonehaven Drive
- City Hall, 110 Laurier Avenue West
- St-Laurent Complex, 525 Côté Street
- Canterbury Recreation Complex, 2185 Arch Street
- Infinity Convention Centre, 2901 Gibford Drive (temporary clinic location, June 12-14)

These sites are in addition to hospital-based clinics operating at the Queensway-Carleton Hospital and at the Ottawa Hospital - Civic Campus. Additional community vaccination clinics may open as vaccine supply increases over time.

How to book an appointment

High-priority Neighbourhoods

Beginning Saturday, June 12, all pop-up vaccine clinics will accept residents from any of Ottawa's <u>priority neighbourhoods</u> for a **first dose vaccination**. This includes teachers, staff, students and their households of any school located in a priority neighbourhood. To check your home or school address for eligibility visit <u>OttawaPublicHealth.ca</u>.

Expanding eligibility will raise vaccination rates in priority neighbourhoods and assist in removing some of the greatest barriers to accessing the vaccine. Residents from outside priority neighbourhoods will be directed to available appointments in the <u>provincial booking system</u> or at a participating <u>pharmacy</u>.

Mobile Vaccination Teams

- Mobile vaccination teams are providing vaccinations to congregate care settings, including shelters and homebound residents.
- Homebound residents: We continue to actively work with health partners to support in-home vaccination of homebound healthcare recipients. Homebound health care recipients are currently the only group eligible for in-home vaccination.
 - The EOC continues collaboration with partners to identify additional homebound residents and has begun to immunize them and an essential caregiver, in-home. Homebound clients can request in-home vaccination by themselves, by their caregiver, or by referral from their primary care provider by calling the OPH Vaccine Booking Line at 613-691-5505 Option #2. We are defining a homebound resident as: an individual who has medical, physical, cognitive, or psychosocial needs/conditions that inhibit them from visiting a local clinic, pharmacy, or their primary care provider to receive their COVID-19 vaccination.

Indigenous Clinics

- Wabano Centre for Aboriginal Health and OPH are providing vaccines to First Nation, Inuit and Métis community members 12 and older.

Bruyère Vaccination Clinic

The Bruyère vaccine clinic, in collaboration with OPH, has first and second dose appointments available for eligible residents of priority neighbourhoods and other priority groups that are 12 and older. Residents can visit Bruyere.org to verify eligibility and book their appointment.

Youth 12-17 Years Old

Youth aged 12 and older are eligible to receive the COVID-19 vaccine. Youth must be 12 years old or older on the day of their appointment to book online. If they are currently 11 years old but are turning 12 years old while community clinics are running, please call the Provincial booking line at 1-833-943-3900 for an appointment.

Second Doses

- Residents 80 and over without a second dose appointment are being contacted directly by OPH for guaranteed access to an appointment within the standard second dose interval of 16 weeks.
- Individuals aged 70 and over in 2021, as well as individuals who received their first
 dose of an mRNA vaccine on or before April 18, 2021, are eligible to schedule an
 appointment to receive their accelerated second dose of a COVID-19 vaccine at a
 community clinic through the <u>provincial booking system</u> and call centre.

AstraZeneca

The Province has announced that individuals who received AstraZeneca as their first dose can choose to either receive a second dose of AstraZeneca, or an mRNA (Pfizer or Moderna) vaccine. As per the Province, individuals who received their first dose of the AstraZeneca vaccine 12 weeks ago who would like their second dose of the AstraZeneca vaccine can contact the pharmacy or primary care provider where they received their first dose to book an appointment.

Individuals opting to receive an mRNA vaccine have the option to schedule their second dose appointment at a <u>participating pharmacy</u>, primary care provider or a community clinic by registering for a "second dose only appointment" at a 12-week interval through the <u>provincial booking system</u>.

Residents with eligible health conditions

The Province of Ontario has announced that residents with the following conditions are eligible to receive their second dose of the COVID-19 vaccine earlier than the standard second dose interval of 16 weeks:

- Malignant hematologic disorders and non-hematologic solid tumours receiving active treatment (letter from Champlain Regional Cancer Centre required);
- Organ transplant recipients;
- Individuals who are taking an anti-CD20 agent (e.g., rituximab, ocrelizumab, ofatumumab) and;
- Dialysis patients.

General Information

Appointments in our community clinics become available when new supply is confirmed. This ensures that there is a vaccine available for every resident who arrives for their confirmed appointment.

Almost 200 pharmacies across Ottawa are also receiving vaccines directly from the Province. Participating locations are available on Ontario.ca. Most pharmacies book appointments ahead of time and some allow walk-ins. Eligible residents should check with the pharmacy directly. Select primary care teams are also offering vaccines.
