# Revitalizing Richmond Road

## Key improvements:

- Replacing aging underground utilities, including watermains, storm sewers, and sanitary sewers
- Improving connectivity and safety for pedestrians and cyclists
- Reconfiguring Richmond Road for improved traffic safety
- Constructing Byron Linear Park
- Increasing green space
- Featuring public art
- Creating additional plaza space for the community



# Complete Street Works for Richmond Road

- The Revitalizing Richmond Road project is following a complete streets approach:
  - This involves replacing aging infrastructure on Richmond Rd and Byron Ave.
- Work involves 2.6 km of new storm sewer, 2.8 km of new sanitary sewer, 3.5 km of new watermain.
- Service replacements for businesses and residences on Richmond Rd and Byron Ave.
- Complete streets also involves installing new catch basins and bioswales, widening of sidewalks, new cycle lanes, revised intersections, lighting, and landscaping.
- Temporary servicing will be required during the work. Brief interruptions of water service will be experienced during the replacement of water services. Residents and business owners will be notified in advance.

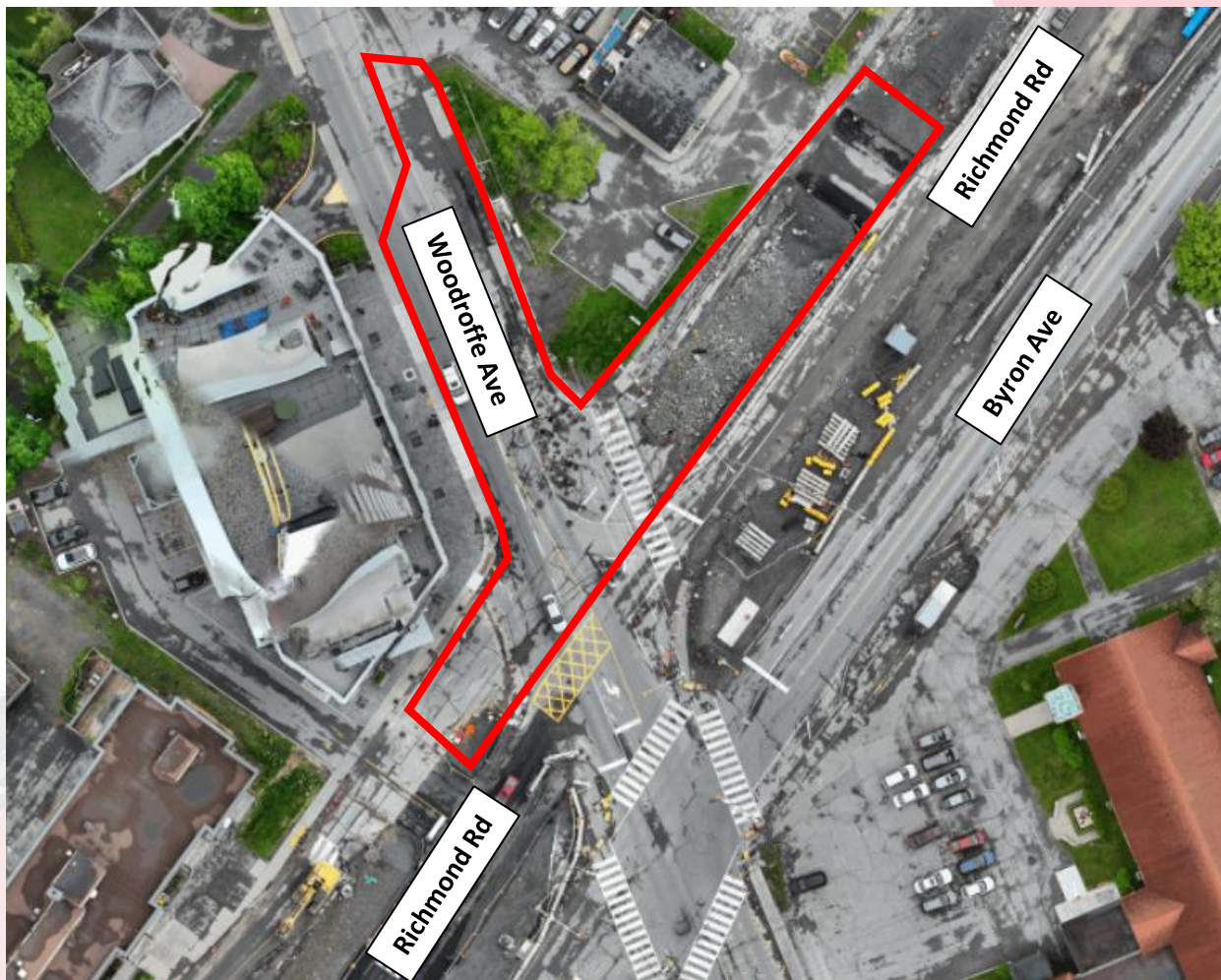
# Milestones for 2025

- Completing Richmond Road to its final alignment from just west of McEwen Avenue (the western limit of the project) to approximately Ancaster Avenue by the end of 2025.
- Advancing the underground utility work from Ancaster Avenue to Woodroffe Avenue.
- Bringing the intersection of New Orchard Avenue North and Richmond Road to its final configuration by the end of 2025 and reopening it to traffic.
- Completing the north portion of the Woodroffe Avenue/Richmond Road intersection including the deep sanitary sewer work on Woodroffe Avenue.
- Kiewit Eurovia Vinci (KEV) will progress the majority of the underground utility works on Richmond Road from Woodroffe Avenue to Cleary Avenue, but some work will be required in 2026 before Richmond Road is brought to its final state in this area.

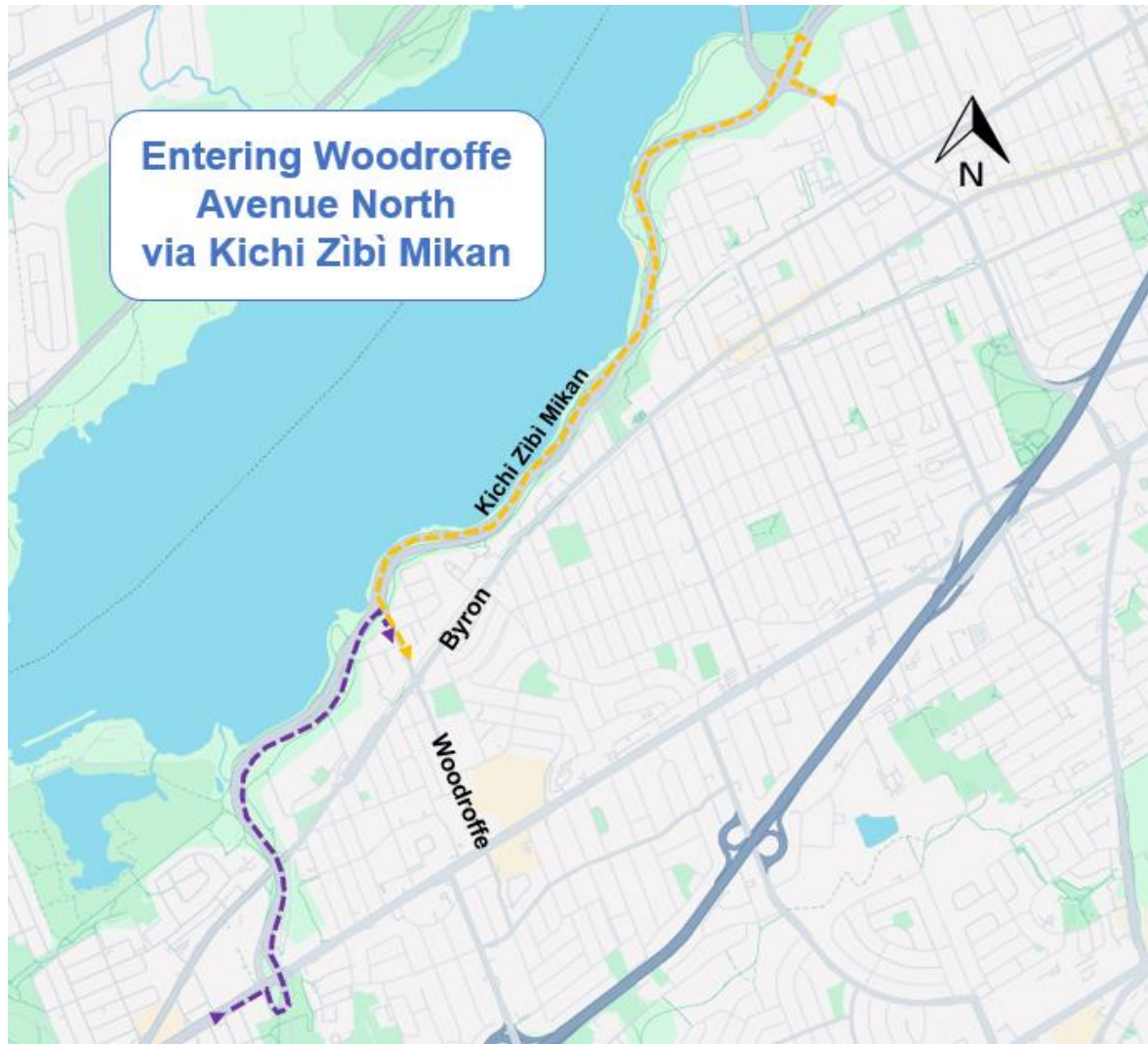
## Woodroffe Avenue North of Richmond

- Woodroffe Avenue north of Richmond Road will be closed for approximately three (3) months starting as soon as June 30, 2025 to advance required utility work and roadway construction.
- The crews will construct the permanent infrastructure for the north portion of the Richmond/Woodroffe intersection as part of this closure.
- Works to be completed include:
  - Deep sanitary sewer replacement in the middle of Woodroffe Avenue
  - New streetlights, traffic signals, and underground electrical conduits
  - Roadway reconstruction
  - New concrete sidewalks and asphalt cycle track

# Local Access for the Woodroffe North Community



- Westbound motorists will use northbound Island Park Drive, turning right on eastbound Kichi Zibi Mikan (KZM), will turn left using the westbound turnaround, turn left onto westbound KZM until turning left on Woodroffe Avenue.
- Eastbound motorists will access KZM from Carling Avenue and travel to Woodroffe Avenue

# Local Access for the Woodroffe North Community

Exiting Woodroffe Avenue North via Kichi Zibi Mikan

- Westbound motorists will turn right onto the Kichi Zibi Mikan (KZM), travel to the westbound turnaround lane and then turn left onto westbound KZM, following KZM to Carling Avenue
- Eastbound motorists will turn right onto KZM and travel to Island Park Drive.
